Lima (City of The Kings) Puno (Titicaca Lake overnight Family House) Bolivia (Uyuni Salt Flat) Cusco (Machupicchu by Car & Rainbown Mountain)

Day 01: International arrival in Lima

Assistance on your arrival in Lima and transfer to your selected hotel. Free time to rest and prepare for starting your trip around this unusual city and magical country.

Day 02: Lima - Juliaca & Puno (Overnight in Family House in Tikonata Island)

a.m. Transfer to Lima Airport for our fly to Juliaca Upon arrival transfer to Tikonata Island The highlights of this road are without doubt the burial towers of Sillustani, enormous cylindrical constructions built long before the Incas. The Sillustani towers are perhaps the finest and the most perfect cylindrical constructions of ancient Peru, as such perfection can be found nowhere else in South America. We will give you a better view into the life of pre - Inca civilizations, and exploring the area you can marvel with the great beauty of the Umayo Lagoon, which is located at the foot of Sillustani natural platform.



You will enjoy of an unforgettable journey on the surrounding and shores of Lake Titicaca, landscapes, traditions, culture and peace. After Sillustani, We take a private car to get the northern part of Lake Titicaca after 1:30 hours driving passing Capachica will arrive to the pier in Ccotos (**small village on the shores of the lake**) we'll take a small boat 20 minutes to reach Ticona 3816 m.s.l., one small island where there is no more than 05 families living in, after settle you in, we are free to walk from edge to edge in this island, or Visit the museum, it's exhibits ceramics and pre-Inca mummies found on the island of Puno. You will see various mummies found on the island, as well as ceramics such as: vessels (**K'eros**), plates (**Chuas**), monoliths, ceremonial feline mask belonging to the Tiahuanaco and Colla culture. There are also agricultural tools made by hand by the islanders such as the plow, yugo (**lluco**),

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chaquitacla, raucanas, trilladeras and others., all the meals will be prepared by the local host, and spend the night in a family house (**basic**) at night probably we'll be lucky to see all the milky way without of the city lights.

Day 03: Puno: Titicaca Lake, Floating Islands of the Uros and Taquile Island - Puno

Early in the morning, we will have an unforgettable by tourist motorboat excursion on the waters of Lake Titicaca to the unique " **Floating Islands** " of the Uros. These ancient inhabitants of the lake, known as the Water Tribe, have built their own " **Islands** " by periodically adding new layers of a type of reed called " **Totora** " (**Scirpus Totora**), vegetable fibre of the Papyrus family. Their homes and boats are also made from this material. We continue our motorboat trip to Taquile Island, inhabited by **Quechua – Speaking Natives** who have developed, down through generations, an efficient and unique social system, as well as fine hand weaving techniques. It is necessary to go up a stairway of more than 567 steps - steps of stone that wind their way among green platforms - to arrive at the Town of Taquile where we will have a break to eat. After lunch in a local Taquile Inn, we have a walk through the various hills and archaeological sites of this 6 km long Island. In the afternoon, return to Puno for overnight at your hotel. Evening free.

Day 04: Puno - La Paz by Tiwanaku

After breakfast Your tour will begin with a private pickup from your hotel at 07:00. The hour - long ride to Tiwanaku will take you on a scenic journey through the High Plateau. Along the way we will pass by the imposing Andes Mountain Range as well as get the opportunity to observe the more traditional, countryside way of life. On Wednesdays it is also possible to make a brief stop at Quellani and witness the weekly cattle market, a dying tradition in this part of the world. Upon arrival at the UNESCO designated ruins of Tiwanaku we will first visit the Lithic and Ceramic Museums, designed to communicate to visitors the impressive history of the pre-Incan Tiwanaku civilization. Following our quick museum tour, we will head to the main attraction: the Tiwanaku ruins. At the archeological site we will explore the cultures main temples including the

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Pyramid of Akapana and Kalasasaya as well as the inspiring Gateways to the Sun and Moon. In addition to the traditional examples of Tiwanaku architecture, giant monoliths and figurative representations are scattered throughout the archeological complex. What is perhaps most impressive about Tiwanaku is the incredible skill and craftsmanship needed to create such architecture. Huge stone blocks weighing as much as 45 tons each are placed with such precision that not a single gap between one to the next exists. The sculptures too are worthy of modern day appreciation- intricate details of both the people and the gods can be seen on the spiritual figures the Tiwanaku revered. A trip to Tiwanaku is more than just a walk through history; it is a breathtaking testament to an ancient civilization that was far advanced beyond their years. After marveling at the impressive archeological ruins, you will be served a full lunch at a delicious nearby café and then continue on to explore the fascinating Sukakollus irrigation system; responsible for creating a year round humid climate ideal for agriculture in the arid high plateau land. Additionally, you will get the chance to visit Pumapunku, known for huge monolith stone structures that are still a mystery to archeologists today. Beyond the temple structure, the full day tour to Tiwanaku will also take you on a visit to the traditional local town. Today, the village that was once the capital of the powerful pre-Incan civilization that ruled the region is home to an indigenous community who still lives in the ways and guards the secrets of old. On our tour we will visit the city's 17th century church, constructed of the very stone of which the main ruins were built. At approximately 14:30 we will depart Tiwanaku and head to La Paz



Evening free day for acclimate, La Paz The city, located in west - central Bolivia 68 km (**42 mi**) southeast of Lake Titicaca, is set in a canyon created by the Choqueyapu River. It is located in a bowl - like depression surrounded by the high mountains of the Altiplano. Overlooking the city is the towering, triple – peaked Illimani. Its peaks are always snow covered and can be seen from many parts of the city. At an elevation of roughly 3,650 m (**11,975 ft**) above sea level, La Paz is the highest capital city in the world Due to its altitude, La Paz has an unusual subtropical highland climate, with rainy summers and dry winters.

for appreciate (**By yourself**) the cultural, historical, architectural, and natural wealth. Visiting The Square Murillo, Cathedral, Palace of Government, Church of San Francisco, Viewer of Quilli Quilli, Gold Museum, Market of the Witches and the Valley of the Moon, located to 15 Km. of the city. The erosion has achieved after the years to form a group of astonishing stony formations that give the visitor the sensation of having discovered an unknown world. A true one and almost " **Real** " lunar landscape.

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Day 05: La Paz - Oruro - Uyuni train Leave Tuesday & Friday optional airfare 150\$USA

After breakfast we leave by bus and train to Uyuni, is a city in the southwest of Bolivia. It primarily serves as a gateway for tourists visiting the world's largest Salt Flat, the nearby Salar de Uyuni. Founded in 1890 as a trading post, the town has a population of 21,400 (**2010 official estimate**). The town has an extensive street-market. It lies at the edge of an extensive plain at an elevation of 3,700 m (**12,139 ft**) above sea level, with more mountainous country to the east. There is little agriculture in the area because water supplies are scarce and somewhat Saline. Today the town's primary function is as a gateway for tourists visiting the world's largest salt flats - the Salar de Uyuni. Each year Uyuni receives approximately 60,000 visitors from around the globe. The city also acts as a gateway for commerce and traffic crossing into and out of Bolivia from and to Chile, and there is a customs and immigration post downtown.

Day 06: Uyuni Salt Lake - Island of The Fish - San Juan

After Breakfast, we departure to the biggest Salt Desert, in mobility (Land Cruiser - 4x4) In the itinerary you visit: " **The Island of the Fish** " populated by numerous giant cacti with heights superior to the 10 meters, from the summit you can contemplate the wonderful landscape of Salting. After our visit to the island we will have lunch and in the afternoon we will continue to San Juan's Population where we will spend the night at Family homes. Island Incahuasi (**Island of the Fish**). Located amid the desert of salt, the Island generally well-known as Included: Breakfast, lunch, dinner, shared jeep + accommodation at Family Homes.

The population of Colchani. - Located to the banks of the great Salt Lake, it serves from main entrance to the desert of salt, also known as " **Dry Port** ", where the intense activity of extraction of salt is observed in handmade form. The residents taught us the drying process, milled and pocketed of the salt, clever for the consumption, after the visit we will continue with the same transport when and to be able to visit: Hotel of Salt. - Located in the middle of Salt Lake, built with blocks of salt, so much external as interior, walls, floor, beds, tables, seats, everything of salt with a beautiful view of the Salt Lake, nowadays it can be visited as a museum. In the afternoon we will arrive to San Juan or Chuvica, spend the night and dinner.

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Day 07: San Juan - Lagoons - Red Lagoon

we leave to Green lagoon - located to the feet of the volcano Licancabur, to a height of 4.350 m.a.s.l., the green colour owes itself high content of magnesium that possess the geologic formations of the area, after our visit to the green lagoon, then we continue to the thermal waters - Polques, there we have lunch, break, then continue to the Red Lagoon our adventure going to Lagoons, visiting in the itinerary the active volcano Ollague, the lagoons of Cañapa, Stinking, Chiarcota and Sling, lagoons that are populated by flamingos, in the afternoon we will continue our journey passing the desert of Siloli where we will observe an interesting rocky formation well - known as the Tree of Stone spend the night and dinner.

Day 08: Red Lagoon - Green Lagoon - Uyuni - La Paz

at 05.00 am wake up call. Leave Laguna Colorada early to make it to the first stop which is Sol de Mañana. Here we will see the geysers at full strength (**thanks to the early cold morning air** !) A stop at the bubbling fumarols is like visiting another planet. Next stop is the Hot springs (breakfast provided) a quick dip in these natural bath will warm you soul and recharge your inner batteries. From the Laguna Challviri hot springs we will drive towards the Laguna Verde passing through the surreal desert of Salvador Dali. (**wild rock formations on the left** !) Arriving at Laguna Verde before 10am we will be able to see the volcano Licancabur guarding the laguna. Next stop is the border transfer for those heading to Chile. Bolivian companies cannot enter Chile and vice versa so there is a swop at the border near Laguna Verde. From Laguna Verde we head back towards Uyuni. Those wishing for a 4 day journey will spend the night in Villa Mar in a rustic lodge and return to Uyuni leisurely on day 4. Those wishing to do it all in 3 days will come back to Uyuni via San Cristobal and arrive approximately at 6pm.

Transfer to Uyuni Airport for our fly to La Paz, arrive transfer to the selected hotel

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Day 09: La Paz - Cusco: Sightseeing tour and Nearby Ruins

Breakfast. Transfer to La Paz for our morning fly to Cusco, arrive transfer to the selected hostel or Hotel, Morning at leisure or we will take a visit by your own Street San Blas The artistic barrio (**Neighborhood**) of narrow and high streets beautiful little plaza and a beautiful paqcha exists; in this barrio numerous artists and artisans reside, there are located the workshops of famous artisans such as the family Mendevil Olave and merida, Panoramic views of Cusco City, Hatunrumivoc is located close to Plaza Nazarenas, not far from Plaza de Armas, It's a narrow pedestrian street. Famous for it's Inca walls where huge stones are precisely carved to fit together without mud or concrete. You'll find the masterpiece, **a 12 Angled Stone**, about halfway down the street The Inca stonework was incredible, actually so good that Spanish conquerors often used the old Inca structure as foundations for their own buildings.

Hatunrumiyoc is a great place too have a closer look at their skills.



leisure The Central Market or Mercado de San Pedro is one of the oldest of Cusco, founded in 1925; despite its age it had no significant changes , but it still remains the largest center of concentration and supply of the city .

The **San Pedro Market** in Cusco sits about an eight minute walk south from Plaza de Armas but couldn't be more different!! On the walk to it you'll generally notice more and more street vendors and ladies in traditional dress sitting on the side of the streets selling nuts, popcorn and other small bags of dried foods. You'll spot more and more local shops (**Tiendas**) selling the most random of things all in the one tienda. If you're looking for an **alpaca** jumper, a freshly made juice, a bag of nectarines, some plantains to fry, **butifaras** (**Ham sandwiches served on French bread**) or some cheesy gifts for your parents or friends back home you're definitely on your way to the right place !

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In the afternoon, we will have a guided sightseeing tour of Cusco visiting the Main Square, the Cathedral and the Temple of the Sun or **Korikancha**. Then, we drive out of the City to visit the Inca sites of Kenko, Tambomachay, Puca Pucara and the impressive Fortress of **Sacsayhuaman**, strategically built on a hill overlooking Cusco and famous for its enormous carved stones, some of them standing over 9m / 30ft high and weighing over 350 tons.



at 20.00 p.m. evening get ready to enjoy a dinner with a folklore show in a typical restaurant where the musicians play their melodies with Andean instruments of beautiful sounds, while typically dressed dancers will show you different ancient Peruvian dances.

Day 10: Cusco - Rainbow Mountain - Cusco

A fantastic day tour (**with trekking**) to the so - called 7 Color Mountain, leaving from Cusco. Located in southern Peru, in the Cusco region, this route will take you through stunning landscapes with glaciers, snowcapped mountains and crystal clear rivers and lakes. Pass by local villages of Quechua descendants and explore the breathtaking surrounding nature. The colors of the Rainbow Mountain will leave you speechless. You will be picked up from your accommodation at around 3.00am and start making your way to Arco (**on the route to Puno**) eventually getting to the Checacupe district (**2 hour journey**). Then we will continue to Pitumarca and a number of small villages till we reach the Hanchipata - Quesuno community (**another 1.5 hours**). From here we start our hike. We will be able to enjoy the view of numerous mountains around as well as the Ausangate glacier, and we will be able to witness up close the local wildlife and camelids in their natural environment. The trek lasts for about 3 hours until we get to the stunning landscape of Vinicunca (**Rainbow Mountains**). Here we will have about one hour to relax and take amazing pictures of this natural wonder. We then hike

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back to the starting point of the trek, and from there return to Cusco ([arriving at approximately 17.00](#)).

Day 11: Cusco: Sacred Valley of the Incas - Sanctuary of Ccochahuasi - Pisac Market - Perolinyoc Waterfall - Hanging Hotel (Sky Lodge) Ollantaytambo (Private guide and car)

Early morning excursion to the Urubamba Valley, the Sacred Valley of the Incas. on our way 30' from Cusco we can stop in Ccochahuasi Animal Sanctuary ([Santuario Animal de Ccochahuasi](#)) The family-run and privately owned Ccochahuasi Animal Sanctuary rescues and rehabilitates animals that have been ill-treated or victims of poaching. Visitors can tour the grounds and meet some of the rescued animals, such as pumas, Peruvian hairless dogs, alpacas, and llamas, as well as the gigantic Andean condor



After getting to know the animals, you can take some time to visit some of the small [onsite exhibits](#), where you can understand how the animals wool is refined and naturally dyed, before finally being expertly woven into fabrics, tapestry's, clothing or a variety of other products. Women from native communities offer live examples of traditional ([and intricate](#)) weaving techniques, using basic tools and wooden looms.

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Visit to the picturesque Indian Pisac Market held on **Tuesdays, Thursdays and Sundays**, the shopping paradise of the Andes where barter is still practiced. Enjoy the unique atmosphere during a typical lunch. In the afternoon, passing through the Towns of Calca and Urubamba, we

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visit the Inca Fortress and Citadel of Ollantaytambo, built to guard the entrance to this part of the Valley, and protect it from possible invasion from the tribes in the Lower jungle. You can walk through the quaint streets of the nearby Town, and get a good idea of what this strategic Military, Religious, and Agricultural Centre was like during the era of the Inca Empire.



Waterfall of Perolnuyoc

Hike to the Waterfall and Archaeological Site of Perolnuyoc is an unusual tour that mixes the cultural with ecotourism. A tour that will take you deep into the sacred valley and you will appreciate one of the spectacular works of nature hidden in a forest of abundant vegetation, you will be able to refresh yourself in its crystal clear waters. We will also visit the archaeological center that sits on top of the Racaypata or Perolnuyoc waterfall. we will have lunch in a family house of **Rural community in Socma** they will teach You how to hew a variety of Marble stone. The most representative dish is La Merienda (**Meal with Corn, Guinea Pig, Special Tortilla**) The typical drink is the chicha made of fermented corn " **Chicha de Jora** " and frutillada, fermented strawberry last one. The most relevant celebrations are on May 03rd " **Cruz Velacuy** " festivity to the cross of Jesus Crist and on August 02nd " **Angels Virgins** " with typical dances,



Then we will stop for 5' to see a Hanging Hotel, sleep in this hotel, people must climb 400 mt. of Via Ferrata or hike an intrepid trail through ziplines. One night at this place will make your dreams come true. This hotel is composed of three exclusive capsule Suites with a total capacity of 8 people. The vertically hanging transparent capsule suites are situated at the top of our 1200 ft mountain with a 300 degree view of the majestic Sacred Valley. Hand crafted out of aerospace aluminum and weather resistant polycarbonate, each suite comes complete with four beds, a dining area and a private bathroom



At the end we will visit Ollantaytambo Ruins lie in the town of Ollantaytambo situated

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approximately 60km from Cusco at the end of the Sacred Valley and are a great example of Incan architecture. In the mid-15th century the Inca Emperor Pachacuti conquered the town of Ollantaytambo and re-built it as a religious, political and military complex as well as a resting place for the Inca nobility. During the Spanish conquest of Peru, Ollantaytambo served as headquarters for Manco Inca the resistance leader who retreated to Ollantaytambo following his defeat in the siege of Cusco in 1536. He then subsequently successfully defeated the Spanish in a battle at Ollantaytambo by flooding the valley below. The Spanish led by Hernando Pizarro subsequently returned with a far greater army and eventually took control of Ollantaytambo while Manco Inca fled to the city of Vilcabamba. The fortress is located on the western side in the area known as Aracma Ayllu and is made up of a series of imposing, terraces, temples, platforms, paths and walls and offers excellent views of the surrounding countryside, the town of Ollantaytambo itself and the Incan storehouses or 'Qollqa' built on the Pincuylluna mountain opposite the ruins.

Day 12: Ollantaytambo - Santa Teresa (By Car) Aguas Calientes (trek 3 hrs)

After breakfast, We continue the journey to Santa Teresa, along a winding ascent toward the Abra Malaga and the snowy veronica is located at an altitude of 4,316 meters where we can enjoy the magnificent landscapes of the Cusco geography. After a short break of 15 minutes in the Abra Malaga, the descent into the jungle of the Inca trail through the different climates that combine the paradisiacal landscapes of majestic snow to the hot jungle of the Inca Trail to Machu Picchu is undertaken. To the height of Alfamayó find an Inca trail in admirable condition fully paved. Place where begins the process of asphalt road, continue towards the district of Santa Maria; Located at an altitude of 1,575 meters

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Then we can walk for 30' to **Santa Teresa Hot Spring** Constructed on the slopes of the mountain and on the banks of the Urubamba River, the thermal water complex has three pools, of different sizes and depths, which are supplied with medicinal water that varies between 40°C and 44°C. The thermal baths of Santa Teresa differ mainly from the other springs of Peru

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because of its crystalline waters. These medicinal waters possess properties to treat cutaneous ulcers, bone pain and rheumatism. In the thermal baths you can also submerge under cold streams from the Uripata lagoons, which provides a comforting sensation. At the bottom of the pools there is soft sand and around the pools we can contemplate rocks, vegetation, the sound of the river and the mountain. The thermal baths of Santa Teresa are fully equipped with bathrooms, showers, dressing rooms, soccer fields, space for camping, cafeteria, kiosk for food and beverage supply and a viewpoint. It also has a hydro massage system. It is a very pleasant place to rest after extensive walks such as Machu Picchu and Choquequirao

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Santa Teresa - Aguas Calientes (Machupicchu Town)

Afternoon we will take a car to Machupicchu Hydroelectric Station it's take us 30' drive to continue the journey of adventure, those who wish to walk are three hours of Hydroelectric to Aguas Calientes " **Town of Machu Picchu** "; where we will place in our respective assigned hotels in this itinerary tours to Machu Picchu will have some free time,

Day 13: Aguas Calientes (Machupicchu Town) Machu Picchu - Waynapicchu - Sun Gate - Cusco

rise to Bus Station for a 20' journey to the famous Inca Citadel of Machu Picchu, also known as " **The Lost City of the Incas** ". bus drive, climbing 6km of winding road, to the incredible site of **Huayna Picchu** also known as **Wayna Picchu** (Quechua " **Young Peak** ") The number of daily visitors allowed to enter Huayna Picchu is restricted to 200 is a mountain in Peru around which the Urubamba River bends. It rises over Machupicchu, the so - called lost city of the Incas, and divides it into sections. The Incas built a trail up the side of the Huayna Picchu and built temples and terraces on its top. The peak of Huayna Picchu is about 2,720 meters (**8,920 ft**) above sea level, or about 360 meters (**1,180 ft**) higher than Machu Picchu. According to local guides, the top of the mountain was the residence for the high priest and the local virgins.

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Machupicchu Every morning before sunrise, the high priest with a small group would walk to Machu Picchu to signal the coming of the new day. The **Temple of the Moon**, one of the three major temples in the Machu Picchu area, is nestled on the side of the mountain and is situated at an elevation lower than Machu Picchu. Adjacent to the Temple of the Moon is the Great Cavern, another sacred temple with fine masonry. The other major local temples in Machu Picchu are the Temple of the Condor, Temple of Three Windows, Principal Temple, "Unfinished Temple", and the Temple of the Sun, also called the Torreón. Then we'll participate in a guided tour of the Citadel, visiting the Main Plaza, the Circular Tower, **The Sacred Sun Dial** the Royal Quarters, the Temple of the Three Windows and various burial grounds.



The Sun Gates of Machu Picchu boast a picture - perfect vantage point overlooking Peru's most famous ruins. Tourists flock to this outcrop high in the Andes Mountains to enjoy the same view featured on virtually every postcard depicting the Machu Picchu citadel. Also known as Inti Punku, the Sun Gates consist of two stones perched at a narrow passage in the crevice of the mountain just above Machu Picchu. The sun shines brilliantly through this portal each day when it rises - hence the name.



Machupicchu Museum & Orchid Garden

The museum has the aspect of a small rural house, but at the same time dynamic and modern, where you can find around 400 cultural pieces divided in 7 rooms, that explain in the simplest and most enjoyable way the history and significance of Machu Picchu. Among the best examples displayed in the museum the following stand out: the constructive tools of copper and bronze, as well as pins and anthropomorphic representations, a clear proof of metallurgical ability of the Incas; we can also find lithic objects and vessels made of clay, possibly used to do rituals. The site museum also offers visitors the possibility to explore the "Orquideario" (**The**

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Orchid Garden), with more than 400 species of plants and a "Mariposario" (**Butterfly Garden**) that houses species unique in the world. **The Andean Cock-of-the-Rock** is Peru's national bird. One of the most famous birds of Peru with stunning head-dress of orange-red feathers that remind some of the orange-red fringe that Incas used to wear as a badge of his rank.

Day 14: Cusco - Lima

a.m. Transfer Cusco Airport for your fly to Lima, This day we will have guided sightseeing tour to the most attractive and important sites in Lima, the " **City of Kings** ". The tour includes Lima's Historical Centre, passing by Plaza San Martin, The Main Plaza, the Government Palace, the City Hall, the Cathedral and its Religious Art Museum, the Church of Santo Domingo, with the tombs of Santa Rosa and San Martin de Porras, and Lima's Colonial Balconies. We will visit the Convent and Church of San Francisco, the greatest monumental complex of Colonial Art in America and Cultural Heritage of Humanity. The tour includes a visit to the Basilica of 21 altars, Convent of Cloisters, Capitulary and Clementine Rooms, Chorus and Library of the Monks, a Museum showing 11 paintings of the Rubens School, the Sacristy with paintings of Surbaran and Ribera, its great patio decorated with Seville tiles of XVIth Century, Moorish arches and underground Catacombs. We will also visit El Olivar Park with olive trees brought from Spain in the XVth Century, the Central Park of Miraflores and Larcomar, a symbol of modern Lima and a tourist and entertainment centre as well as a privileged site to enjoy an amazing view of the Pacific Ocean.

Day 15: Lima - Home

a.m. **Optional 50USA** Tours to The Larco Museum (Spanish: **Rafael Larco Herrera Archaeological Museum**) is a privately owned museum of pre-Columbian art, located in the Pueblo Libre District of Lima, Peru. The museum is housed in an 18th century vice-royal mansion built over a 7th century pre-Columbian pyramid. It showcases chronological galleries that provide a thorough overview of 4,000 of Peruvian pre-Columbian history. In 1925, Rafael Larco Herrera acquired a collection of vases and other pieces from Alfredo Hoyle, his brother-in-law. There were approximately 600 ceramic pieces in all. The arrival of these objects ignited to collector's enthusiasm in his son, Rafael Larco Hoyle. Soon after, Larco Herrera left his in charge of the collection and those pieces completed the first collection of what would become the Rafael Larco Herrera Museum. During that same year, Larco Hoyle received some advice from his uncle, Victor Larco Herrera, a founder of the first museum in Lima. I have urged Larco Hoyle to form a new museum in Lima, one that could guard all the archaeological relics that were continually being extracted by clandestine excavators. Larco Hoyle agreed with his uncle and proceeded to create a museum that would carry on his father's legacy. Larco Hoyle purchased two large collections: 8,000 pieces from Roa and 6,000 pieces from Carranza. He has also purchased several small collections in Chicama Valley, Trujillo, Viru, and Chimbote. Within a year, the collection had grown significantly and display cases were installed in a small house on the Chiclín estate. On July 28, 1926, Independence Day, the museum opened its doors to the public. Located in a unique vice-royal mansion of the 18th century built over a 7th century pre-Columbian pyramid is surrounded by beautiful gardens. Features the finest gold and silver collection from Ancient Peru and the famous erotic archaeological collection, one of the most visited Peruvian tourist attractions. For an unforgettable experience, Larco is one of the few Museums in the world where visitors can also choose to enter the storage area with its 45,000 classified archaeological objects.
